School is just around the corner! We are so excited to see where God takes us this year at Mt. Moriah Christian School. He continues to send blessings our way and guide our steps. This year we will be welcoming over 138 students in Kindergarten through 8th grade and over 53 in preschool. That is a blessing in itself! We've added additional staff to help with the added students and parents will once again be part of the team. We are so blessed to be able to open the doors to have parent volunteers for our activities. After being secluded for Covid-19 reasons, it will be a breath of fresh air for all of us.

DISCOVERY ROOM

This year we have established a new dimension to our Kindergarten. We will have a "Discovery Room" for our students to have a hands-on learning experience. Since we have 24 students registered, we needed a plan to help them learn in the best way possible. We will be dividing the students into groups of 12, and they will attend 180 days of school. Each group will have a time for academic learning with one of the three teachers as well as time for discovery: playing with manipulatives, art, music, story time, large and small motor activities, and most importantly, relationship building.

"Not that I have already reached the goal or am already perfect, but I make every effort to take hold of it because I also have been taken hold of by Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:12)

I reflect on this verse often. In fact, I am finding it more and more to be my favorite verse. It keeps me from being discouraged when I fall short. It challenges me to press on and "live a life worthy of the calling that I have received" (Ephesians 4:1). It reminds me that the "goal is to know Christ and experience the mighty power that raised Him from the dead" (Philippians 3:10). It reminds me that suffering with Him and for Him is not something I should fear or be ashamed of but something I should desire. Because all of this is part of a journey. And the end of the journey is knowing Him completely– and when He appears, "we shall be like Him, for we will see Him as He really is" (I John 3:2).

Paul realizes the struggle that goes on between human nature and the new creation. We have been crucified with Christ, we have been raised with Christ. We become a new creation. But we aren't perfect. That doesn't mean that we should be content with who we are, but we should make every effort to become more like Jesus because of what Jesus has done for us. Our journey continues. He has taken ahold of us.

So, to wrap this up short and sweet, I am not there yet. It's not just "a Jeep thing," and I am not using that as an excuse to be who I am. But I am using that as motivation to become who God wants me to be. I want to encourage you to do the same. You aren't there yet. Don't be satisfied with who you are. Strive to know Him and to become more like Him.
