Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ. - Col. 3:23-24

Welcome back to "the real world".

Well, that's what I call it. I have spent three out of the last five weeks being involved in kid's and youth ministry; one week of Vacation Bible School and two weeks of Camp Carmel. Personally, these have become some of my favorite weeks of the year. Ask all the people who partnered in these ministries alongside of me; it's intentional, it's intense, and it's exhausting. So why do we do it? Because we love God, we love these kids, and these are weeks, days and moments that we get to show and tell kids about Jesus. It's that simple.

When these weeks are over, there are mixed emotions of joy, sorrow, and fatigue for the people ministering. There are many "success" stories; kids receiving Christ, kid's being baptized, kids rededicating their lives, or simply relationships that are built on Christ that will last for a lifetime. There are the sorrows; kids having to go home to abusive families or relationships, kids who are struggling with addictions, bullying, or worse. And then there is the fatigue. The ministers have invested so much prayer, time, effort, resources, love—and mostly themselves—into the concentrated week of ministry that there is this extreme feeling of "withdrawal". During the weeks, they have become reliant on the strength and joy that the Holy Spirit has supernaturally provided. And then, the kids have gone home. And we return to "the real world".

This has happened to me for years, more than I care to count or admit. My pastor would take me aside and pray for me in these stages of withdrawal. He would remind me to allow for a time of rest. And he would remind me that "the real world" needs Jesus too. There are still people who need to see and hear about Jesus just as much as those kids do.

Folks, I just wanted to write to you this month and let you know that your Pastor is praying for all of you. I am especially praying for all of you who invested into the summer ministries here at Mount Moriah. I thank God for your commitment and willingness to spend yourself on kids and people. Your labor has not gone in vain. Now get some rest. Let the Spirit revive you. Keep showing and telling the world about Jesus.
