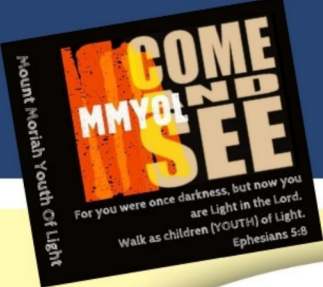

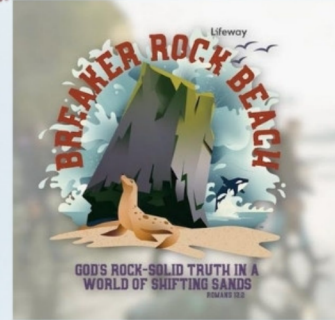

Greetings to you all,

I have been thinking about the phrase, "Hope springs eternal." This phrase comes from a portion of "An Essay on Man" by Alexander Pope. I haven't read the whole essay, but I have heard this phrase for as long as I remember. "Hope springs eternal in the human breast; Man never Is, but always To be blest. The soul, uneasy, and confin'd from home, rests and expatiates in a life to come." I find myself looking at this poetry much like I look at most art. I don't fully understand what it means. But I like the beauty of it. And in some ways, I can identify with it.

As a Christian, I often feel as this essay reflects. Within my heart—and maybe your heart as well—there is this constant hope for blessing, someplace better, a chance to rest, and a thinking of a life to come. Yet I sometimes live my life as if those are simple wishes that may never become reality, as if they will never happen. Let me explain quickly.

There is a difference between wishes and hopes. I like the way Tanya Trusler puts it, "Hope mainly expresses a desire that is possible or likely to happen. Wish usually expresses a desire that is impossible or unlikely to happen." Stop and let me remind you that "with God all things are possible." (Matthew 19:26) But that doesn't change by our desire, it relies completely upon His will. We too often confuse the two words and too often wrongly use them interchangeably. I "hope" something happens. Or I wish some things would change.

I think we too often live in the state of wishes. I "hope" that someday I won't be sick or sad anymore. I "hope" that I will receive a blessing. I "hope" that I will have eternal life. But although we may have to wait for these things, the Bible states that we don't have to wish and wonder. These things are more than possible, they are more than likely to happen. They are the promises and realities that we already possess, though some not on this side of heaven. This is the HOPE we have in Jesus.

Romans 8:23-25 (NLT) "And we believers also groan, even though we have the Holy Spirit within us as a foretaste of future glory, for we long for our bodies to be released from sin and suffering. We, too, wait with eager hope for the day when God will give us our full rights as his adopted children, including the new bodies he has promised us. We were given this hope when we were saved. (If we already have something, we don't need to hope for it. But if we look forward to something we don't yet have, we must wait patiently and confidently.)"
