Every day abused, neglected, and abandoned children are introduced to the foster system. Many of these children will enter the system with only the clothing on their backs. They are removed from their homes without their favorite toy, blanket, hoodie, or essentials. Our local Children and Youth Services (CYS) touches over 1000 children annually. In addition to the foster system, our local Women's shelter also services many children. These children are not fostered, as they arrive homeless with a single parent who is most likely experiencing domestic violence and other abuse.

We will be collaborating with our local CYS, Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), and other resources who will identify and refer children to our ministry. The Closet of Hope will serve children ages birth to teens, offering a FREE shopping experience to provide them with a basic wardrobe and essentials and, most importantly, showing children and their families the love of Jesus. We are all missionaries for God's Kingdom!

MEET THE BROWN FAMILY

The Brown family has been a staple at Mount Moriah Church for quite some time. Jim and Mina have been members since the 1970s. Karen and Bill Wilson, also long-time members of the church and neighbors of the Browns, invited the Brown family to first attend when they were looking for a new church home. One of the first things Jim and Mina noticed was how they were greeted at the door and warmly welcomed. "Everyone made us feel welcome, and they allowed us to serve," Mina explained. And serve, they certainly have!

Jim has served on the trustee board in the past. Mina has served on various boards here at the church and currently holds a position as a deaconess on the Diaconate Board. Mina has also been a VBS director and teacher, BYF teacher, and Sunday School teacher. She currently teaches "The Explorers Class," (a class Jim also attends) which she describes as "a wonderful, small, discussion-based group of all ages that has worked through the books of the Bible and is currently using a study by Dr. David Jeremiah."



In addition to teaching, Mina spearheads the Operation Christmas Child mission here at Mount Moriah, which has functioned as a drop-off center for over fifteen years. Our church continues to diligently pack shoe boxes, incorporating that mission into our Christian school, where students collect items for six weeks and then help pack the boxes themselves.

Mina has been involved with the Mount Moriah Christian School since its inception in the 1980s. She is currently a music and middle school history teacher. Continuing her passion for missions, both here at home and abroad, Mina has traveled to Nicaragua, Japan, Brazil, and Peru. These missionary trips have had different focuses; some involved a medical and dental mission, while others focused on teaching the English language. However, all of these trips have allowed her to share the love of Christ with people around the world.

Jim and Mina believe that Mount Moriah can give your family a solid, Bible-based foundation. Their son, Brian, is actively involved in the missions at his church in Parkersburg, West Virginia. Their daughter, Michelle, still attends Mount Moriah and frequently contributes to the Operation Christmas Child mission alongside her mother. Their youngest son, Mike, along with his wife, Marcy, and their two children followed God's calling to Peru where they work at the South America Mission (SAM) Academy educating the children of other missionaries.
